

Roles/Activities - What Tier(s)?

- 1. Participation on planning and decision-making teams
- 2. Working with another math teacher who teaches the same math class during the same period to create homogeneous groups for instruction
- 3. Data collection for progress reporting
- 4. Selecting additional interventions for small groups
- 5. Assistance to classroom teachers in differentiating instruction
- 6. Professional development for teachers on positive behavioral support
- 7. Conducting small group counseling sessions
- 8. Demonstration of targeted interventions
- 9. Teaching an intensive reading course for struggling readers
- 10. Analyzing student progress in relation to language underpinnings
- 11. Assistance to teachers in making decisions about progress
- 12. Making accommodations to curriculum, assessment, and instruction for students with disabilities
- 13. Progress reporting to parents
- 14. Coordinating interventions
- 15. Administration of follow-up testing after literacy screenings to determine areas of need
- 16. Ascertain students already identified as having disabilities coming into the school
- 17. Having students do different activities in a science class
- 18. Observation of selected students in the classroom
- 19. Participation on teacher assistance teams
- 20. Working with others to make decisions about progress
- 21. Administration of prescriptive assessments on selected students
- 22. Targeted diagnostic intervention for a short time for selected students
- 23. Participation on child study teams to establish need for comprehensive evaluation
- 24. Coaching teachers in the use of Curriculum-Based Measurement
- 25. Administration of normative diagnostic and dynamic assessments on *selected* students as part of a comprehensive evaluation

What an SLP's Workload Might Look Like in an RTI Approach

Face-to-Face with students

- screenings and observations
- evaluations
- 1:1 time for students with an IEP
- 1:1 time for students without an IEP
- small group of students with an IEP present
- small group of students without an IEP
- whole group instruction with SLP as sole instructor
- whole group instruction with SLP as co-teacher

On Behalf of Students

- child study/eligibility/IEP meetings
- verbal referral discussions with staff
- *IEP consult* time with teachers
- consults with other professionals
- teacher consults re: differentiated instruction, whole class impact including students with and/or without IEPs
- writing documents (evaluations/IEP/Medicaid)
- file reviews (SPED and Cum) and scoring curriculum-based measures
- student data: report cards, daily logs, outside contacts
- lesson plans

Other Activities

- school meetings: PTA, faculty, department, committee,
- clerical: emails, making copies
- lunch
- professional development to staff
