

<u>Civilizations</u>- groups of people who lived together in an organized way and shared beliefs and resources
<u>Hunter-gatherers/nomads</u> people who roam to find their food; they do not settle down and stay in one place



Answer:

Rivers had several important <u>effects</u> on early river valley civilizations like Mesopotamia. These rivers provided a reliable source of water for drinking, growing food, farming, fishing, and trade. Because their needs were met by the river, people were no longer nomads and civilizations grew.
