- Respond to the prompt below. Your answer should contain at least two pieces of evidence from this week's studies that you have documented on your FRAMEs about the Inner and Outer Planets.
- Prompt 1: Choose one of the planets. Imagine you are an astronaut. Being an expert on the geography, environment (temperature), gravity, and atmospheric conditions of your planet, you are selected for a mission to travel to and successfully survive on the planet for a short amount of time before being safely brought back home.
