Factual Questions

- Require finding a fact in the information that you have read.
- The answer is right there in the passage/text.

Characteristics of Good Answers:

- Is a complete thought.
 - o Has a subject
 - o Has a verb

 Is related to information in the passage/text.

Answers the question.

Big Picture Questions: Require you to figure out the main idea or big message or theme of the passage/text. May ask for the purpose of the writer. May ask for summary information: setting or tone.

Key Words in Big Picture Questions:

Main Idea

The big idea in a paragraph or passage/text.

Example:

This passage/text is about how people lived during the

Renaissance.

Purpose

The author's reason for writing the passage/text.

Example:

The author wants to convince the reader to exercise every day.

Summary

A short statement that tells about a long passage/text.

Example:

The passage/text is a story about a man who breaks his

arm and learns a lesson.

Message

The author's communication in writing to the reader. What the author wants the reader to know or understand.

Example:

The author wants us to understand that people should not say mean things.

Theme

Another word for "message" or what the author wants the reader to know.

Example:

The theme of this passage/text is that being safe is better than being sorry.

Setting

The place in which the story is located.

Example:

This takes place in the African jungle.

Tone

The feeling or emotion of the passage/text. The emotions the author is expressing through the use of certain words like adjectives and adverbs.

Example:

This passage/text is angry. The author shows anger through the ways Peter acts by throwing things and yelling.

Predicting Questions Require you to make a guess or forecast about what will happen in the future.
