- 8. What did you learn by doing this assignment?
- 9. How did you grow or develop?
- 10. Of what are you most proud?
- 11. How does the eportfolio artifact illustrate the connection(s) you've made between yourself and the course material?
- 12. In what ways would you do things differently if you could do it over again?
- 13. What did you discover about yourself?
- 14. How does it relate to your future? Your career?
- 15. How does it illustrate your strengths and/or weaknesses?
- 16. How does the portfolio product indicate changes in your worldview and/or awareness of global issues?
- 17. What obstacles and challenges did you have to deal with, and how did this struggle change you?
- 18. How does the portfolio product show that your perspective on the world has deepened?
- 19. How does it relate to your understanding of the world around you?
