In May 2018, I was fortunate to be in the audience in Richmond, Virginia, when Don Deshler illuminated a paradigm shift during his presentation to an audience of more than 200 educators. As we implement *evidence-based practices* in our varied contexts, we collect data that serves as our own *practice-based evidence*. Corroborating this point, Cook & Cook (2011) explain that we need to gather evidence regarding "where and under what conditions a practice works, with whom the practice works, how a practice can be adapted and maintained successfully, and how practitioners feel about a practice" (p. 1). Using conceptual understandings from design research methodology, can we make creative adaptations that respond to school, classroom, and student contextual factors? How do we adapt responsively and responsibly? Read more¹

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
