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## Feature Article: What are OTRs and Why Should You be Using Them?

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## **Defining OTRs**

When I first heard the term "opportunity to respond (OTR)," it sounded technical, and I wasn't exactly sure what it meant. As it turns out, there is a significant body of research indicating that when teachers engage students by giving them frequent opportunities to respond, all kinds of wonderful things happen. Dr. Terry Scott, Director of the Center for Instructional and Behavioral Research in Schools, notes that different types of OTRs have three things in common: first, they are delivered by the teacher, second, they are focused on the curriculum, and third, they ask students to think and do!

### 10,00 Data Sets from Classrooms in Kentucky


For the last 5 years, I've had the privilege of working with Dr. Terry Scott, and I've been impressed by the fact that he has collected over 10,000 data sets from observations in 6,730 elementary classrooms, 1,544 middle school classrooms, and 1,983 high school classrooms across the state of Kentucky. This data was collected by a team of highly trained coders who collect data on both group and individual OTRs including verbal responses, choral responses, use of response cards, manipulatives and gestures, and peer discussion. Classrooms are coded for 15-minute time periods when teachers are delivering content, and then a report is generated with easy-to-understand graphs showing overall OTR rates as well as group and individual OTR rates and shared with teachers. After analyzing this large data set, Dr. Scott and his colleagues have drawn several major conclusions.
