# SIM IN THE NEWS

Twelve SIM Interventions have recently been reviewed by the National Center on Intensive Intervention (NCII)'s Technical Review Committee and were listed as part of the NCII Academic and Behavioral Interventions Tools Charts this month.



On their website, they house several databases, called Tools Charts, to help teams make decisions about academic and behavior screening tools, interventions, and progress monitoring tools. Before adding a product to their Tools Charts, a Technical Review Committee uses an extensive and rigorous multi-level review process There is a submission process for each individual intervention that follows an annual timeline.

Several SIM authors have submitted the research studies they have conducted on their published Learning Strategy to be reviewed by NCII reviewers for the Academic or Behavior Interventions Tools Charts and twelve SIM Interventions have been added to the charts.
