# SIM institutes for 2005, potential PD requirements

This issue of Stratenotes is full of useful information for SIM Professional Developers. We start with descriptions of the SIM institutes offered by CRL in 2005. We have made a few changes to the lineup this year.

Two new institutes have been added in January: one for preservice educators to learn about Learning Strategies and one exploring the basics of instructional coaching.

Two institutes have been renamed: SIM Reading and Writing Strategies replaces SIM Level 1 and More SIM Strategies replaces SIM Level 2. In addition, we are now offering two levels of Content Enhancement institutes.

### Strategic Instruction Model Professional Development Opportunities in 2005

University of Kansas Center for Research on Learning • Lawrence, Kansas

The Strategic Instruction Model (SIM), developed by researchers and teachers at the University of Kansas Center for Research on Learning, is an approach to teaching adolescents who struggle with becoming good readers, writers, and learners. SIM is based on the reality that for adolescents to meet high standards, they must be able to read and understand large volumes of complex, difficult reading materials. Addi-

tionally, they must acquire the skills to express themselves effectively in writing. The instructional components of SIM take the processes that are necessary for learning and break them down into manageable steps, enabling students to successfully meet standards.

#### SIM Learning Strategies Institute for Preservice Educators January 4-8, 2005 (Tues. noon-Sat. noon) • \$800

The purpose of this institute is to enable preservice educators in teacher education programs to provide empirically validated interventions from the Strategic Instruction Model (SIM) to prospective teachers. This institute will focus on exploring strategies from the SIM Learning Strategies Curriculum. Participants will explore several learning strategies and will be provided sample syllabi, books, and teaching resources that can be used to modify existing courses or construct new courses. Registration should be postmarked by November 19, 2004. *Late registration is an additional \$25*.

#### Instructional Coaching January 6-8, 2005 (Thurs.- Sat.) • \$450

This institute will offer an opportunity for educators to learn the basics of instructional coaching. The methods that coaches can use to enable instructional improvements will be emphasized. This institute is provided for professional developers and other educational professionals who want to accelerate professional learning in schools. Participants do not need a knowledge of the Strategic Instruction Model, and specific SIM interventions will not be addressed in this institute. The workshop will address *how* to coach, not *what*. Registration should be postmarked by November 19, 2004. *Late registration is an additional \$25*.

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#### Teaching Content to All: Effective College Teaching May 31-June 4, 2005 (Tues. noon-Sat. noon) • \$800

This institute is designed for all college/ university faculty who are engaged in teacher preparation, interested in honing their teaching skills, or new to the profession of teaching university students. This institute will enable faculty to implement a variety of empirically validated teaching routines from the Strategic Instruction Model Content Enhancement Series. Content will emphasize inclusive course planning and the implementation of a variety of explicit teaching routines designed to ensure content area mastery of critical ideas and concepts by all students. Participants will explore several routines in depth so that Content Enhancement Routines can be infused into existing courses or new courses can be constructed. Information related to meeting additional SIM CE Professional Developer certification requirements for inservice professional development also will be provided. Teams of individuals from the same institution are encouraged to apply. Registration should be postmarked by April 15, 2005. Late registration is an additional \$25.

## SIM Institute: Writing Strategies June 13-17, 2005 (Mon. noon-Fri. noon) • \$600

This institute is designed for teachers who teach in general education and special education settings to provide them the tools necessary to incorporate the SIM writing curriculum into their courses. Participants will receive instruction in the SIM strategies for writing sentences, paragraphs, and themes. Sessions will be interactive, and participants will have time each day to practice and plan how to incorporate new information into their courses. The sessions are designed to be relevant for instructors at almost all levels (Grade 3 to post-secondary). Individuals teaching English, language arts, communications, or learning strategies courses in a general education setting will find this institute practical and stimulating. The four-day institute begins at noon

on June 13 and ends by noon on June 17. Registration should be postmarked by May 2, 2005. *Late registration is an additional \$25.* 

#### SIM Reading and Writing Strategies (formerly Level 1) June 21-24, 2005 (Tues. a.m.-Fri. noon) • \$525

This institute will introduce teachers to the foundations of SIM, then teach them to implement research-based interventions to help students acquire the skills necessary to understand grade-level reading materials. Institute participants will be offered reading strategies and the Sentence Writing Strategy. Time will be given to planning for implementation. Registration should be postmarked by May 2, 2005. Late registration is an additional \$25.

#### More SIM Strategies (formerly Level 2) June 21-24, 2005 (Tues. a.m.-Friday noon) • \$525

This institute will offer instruction in additional SIM reading, writing, and other Learning Strategies. Participants who have attended an introductory SIM institute in the past and have implemented strategies will be able to select more strategies to support their literacy efforts. In addition to reading and writing strategies, selections may include strategies related to motivation, improving assignments, and studying and remembering information. Registration should be postmarked by May 2, 2005. *Late registration is an additional \$25*.

SIM Institute: Introduction to Content Enhancement Level 1 June 27-30, 2005 (Mon. a.m.-Thur. p.m.) • \$600

#### SIM Institute: More Content Enhancement Level 2 July 25-July 29, 2005 (Mon. a.m.-Thur. p.m.) • \$600

The two institutes in Content Enhancement are designed to provide an opportunity for teachers to learn methods to teach large amounts of content to academically

diverse classes in "learner-friendly" ways. In these hands-on institutes, participants will plan how to use CE, a set of teacher routines developed through research at the Center for Research on Learning, to enhance the ways they present subjectarea content and improve students' ability to organize, understand, and remember critical information. CE is intended to make content more accessible to students without diluting it. General and special education teachers can benefit. During sessions, participants will learn routines from the CE series and then invent ways to implement the routines within their own courses. The CE routines include ways to plan courses, units, and lessons. Ways to teach the mastery of concepts, the understanding of reading assignments, the mastery of the meaning of vocabulary words, the development of answers to critical questions, the improvement of the quality of assignments, and how to understand and remember key topic and main idea information are important parts of CE. Individuals in Level 2 must have attended an introductory course in CE and implemented some of the routines. Registration should be postmarked by May 2, 2005. Late registration is an additional \$25.

## Potential SIM Professional Developers Institutes for Learning Strategies and Content Enhancement June 20-24, 2005 (Mon. a.m.-Fri. p.m.) • \$750

These two five-day SIM professional development institutes will be conducted simultaneously and will use the Content Literacy Continuum as the unifying framework. Instruction in specific CE Routines and Learning Strategies will not be offered during this week; the focus will be on the professional development process.

Participants will be selected through an application process. Eligible Applicants (a) are experienced SIM teachers,

## Requirements for Potential Professional Developers in SIM Learning Strategies

Individuals eligible to become Professional Developers in Learning Strategies should have (1) a satisfactory experience in teaching SIM strategies to students; (2) understanding of SIM; and (3) commitment to becoming a professional developer.

## Requirements for Certification as a SIM Professional Developer in Learning Strategies

- Attend a minimum of 40 hours in a Potential Professional Developers' Institute (PPDI) and meet the performance demonstration requirements of the institute.
- 2. Serve in an apprenticeship to be completed within two years of the PPDI, including the following:
  - a) Serve for one year in a co-professional development relationship with an active, certified SIM (Learning Strategies) Professional Developer.
  - b) Read specified research articles.
  - c) Respond in writing to 15 frequently asked questions.
  - d) Prepare written outlines of an overview session and a specific strategy professional development session.
  - e) Conduct an overview professional development session and a strategy professional development session with the supervision of a certified SIM professional developer.
  - f) Be observed and evaluated by a certified SIM professional developer during the overview and strategy professional development sessions. Videotapes may be used.
  - g) Implement with students the number of strategies necessary to total four strategies taught through generalization.
  - h) Design a written plan for professional development in your school district or agency in collaboration with other stakeholders.
  - i) Submit all professional development records and evaluations to KU-CRL on an ongoing basis
  - j) Subscribe to STRATEWORKS (first year subscription is included in workshop fee)

- k) Complete all professional development requirements within two years.
- Attend at least one state, regional, or national update session every two years to maintain certified active status.

#### To apply for the Potential Professional Developers Institute in Learning Strategies, professionals must have:

- 1. Two years experience in teaching SIM Learning Strategies
- 2. Participation in one or more SIM Overview Sessions
- 3. Participation in professional development sessions on a minimum of four strategies (from at least two different strands
- 4. Experience teaching at least two strategies through all eight stages of acquisition and generalization (A total of four must be taught before certification.)
- 5. An application submitted by the due date to include the following:
  - a. A completed application form with responses that reflect meeting entry criteria
  - b. One videotape of the applicant conducting the Model Stage of a strategy with students
  - c. Two student folders of products from teaching two different strategies through to generalization.
  - d. Two letters of reference (one from supervisor and one from professional developer)

#### RECORDS OF STRATEGY IMPLEMENTATION

#### PURPOSE OF MAINTAINING A LOG

For a potential Professional Developer, a log of strategy implementation will provide valuable information for professional development sessions with other teachers. Humorous and/or positive student or teacher stories will personalize sessions and add credibility for the professional developer while information about specific teacher behaviors not included in the instructor's manuals can be relayed to teachers who are learning the strategy. For a professional developer or coach, review of the log may provide explanations for rapid student progress or poor student performance, which may be helpful in addressing difficulties encountered in strategy instruction.

#### DIRECTIONS FOR MAINTAINING A LOG

General: Be certain to date each entry and to state which strategy is being implemented

Introductory: Provide information about the students who are receiving strategy instruction (e.g., number of students receiving strategy instruction, ages and/or grade placement levels of these students, range of ability levels, etc.)

Specific: Provide comments related to any or all of the following:

- time, length of lesson
- content covered (an acquisition or generalization stage and/or the portion of the stage being covered)
- manner in which content was presented (e.g., what teacher behaviors occurred, type of activity, etc.)
- your reactions and evaluation
- student responses and reactions to materials and activities, the potential use of the strategy, motivational aspects (e.g., goal statements, value of strategy to students, rationales, etc.) and methods of instruction (each step and specific teacher behaviors within each step)
- student performance and progress
- comment on teacher behaviors, successes, challenges, what was easy or awkward to implement, etc.
- modifications made in teacher procedures or materials
- changes to be made in procedures, materials, or activities when the strategy is implemented again.

#### Administrators' Literacy Leadership Workshop

District and Secondary Building Level Administrators Leading Literacy with the Strategic Instruction Model Marriott Washington Hotel 1221 22<sup>nd</sup> Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20037 January 14, 2005

This workshop provides an opportunity for administrators to learn more about methods and materials to promote literacy developed at the Center for Research on Learning at the University of Kansas. For the past 26 years, KU-CRL has been researching ways to help students with learning difficulties and at-risk students become successful, independent learners.

Schools are under enormous pressure to meet adequate yearly progress. Related to this challenge is the number of diverse learners, including those from poverty, those who are English language learners, and those with disabilities who struggle with literacy. Given the nontrivial numbers of struggling adolescent readers and writers, it is imperative that literacy initiatives be undertaken in secondary schools. When individual teachers implement strategic literacy instruction, it is helpful but insufficient to have the impact required to make a difference in a school's AYP status. A more comprehensive effort is needed, requiring leadership from district and building administrators who have significant roles to play. This workshop will focus on the actions administrators should take to lead literacy initiatives successfully. The research-validated materials and methods from KU-CRL will be the focus of this five-hour opportunity. Beginning with lunch at noon, the workshop continues with the first program session at 1 p.m. and will conclude by 5 p.m.

Registration for this workshop is **\$75**, **if received before Dec. 3, 2004.** For registrations mailed after Dec. 3, add a \$25 late fee.
