No sleight of hand: PD skills take center stage

It's no illusion: All eyes will be on professional development during the 2005 International SIM Conference.

Sessions for this year's conference, which will be July 20-22 in Lawrence, are being carefully planned and sequenced to optimize your opportunities to increase your knowledge, skills, tools, and techniques as they relate to professional development.

The sessions are being developed with special attention to the range of experiences within our ever-growing SIM Network—for those who are new to professional development as well as those who have dedicated careers to PD, for those who are new to SIM as well as those who helped develop the earliest SIM interventions.

At the heart of the conference will be a keynote address by Thomas R. Guskey, professor of educational policy studies and evaluation at the University of Kentucky. Dr. Guskey is known for his work in professional development and educational change.

Dr. Guskey's address will be based on his book, *Evaluating Professional Development* (Corwin, 2000), in which he describes five levels for assessing the effectiveness of professional development activities (see page 2 for more on these levels). After his address, the conference schedule will include time to examine how his message relates to our work and how to leverage what we've learned from him to strengthen our network and individual professional development skills.

Dr. Guskey's work in professional development has looked at many of the same issues we have encountered in our SIM Network, and his writings endorse many of the same principles and values we embrace.

As a supplement to his conference presentation, SIM Professional Developers may be interested in his article, "Results-Oriented Professional Development: In Search of an Optimal Mix of Effective Practices."

Guskey, T.R. (1994) Results-oriented professional development: In search of an optimal mix of effective practices. *Journal of Staff Development*, 15(4), 42-50.

In this article, Dr. Guskey notes that increasingly, everyone from lawmakers to the general public want to see evidence that professional development is effective. He examines what research says about the effectiveness of professional development and presents six guidelines aimed at helping professional developers think through factors that can improve their effectiveness.

Among the points Dr. Guskey makes is one that should sound familiar: Professional development cannot be a one-size-fits-all solution. The teaching and learning process is complex, and individual contexts must be considered when formulating a professional development plan.

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to support professional development
activities is hereby given.

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guidelines underscore the need to recog-
nize and adapt to different contexts and
situations:

1. Recognize change as both an indi-
vidual and organizational process
2. Think big, but start small
3. Work in teams to maintain support
4. Include procedures for feedback on
results
5. Provide follow-up, support, and pres-
sure
6. Integrate programs

Dr. Guskey concludes that "What is
evident from these guidelines is that the
key to greater success in professional
development rests not so much in the
discovery of new knowledge but in our
capacity to use deliberately and wisely
the knowledge we have."

In his conclusion, Dr. Guskey elo-
quently summarizes what the 2005

Evaluating Professional Development

Dr. Guskey's address will be based on his
book, *Evaluating Professional Develop-
ment* (Corwin, 2000), the National Staff
Development Council's Book of the
Year for 2000. In this book, Dr. Guskey
describes the following five levels for
assessing the effectiveness of profes-
sional development activities:

Level 1: Participants' Reactions.
This level—generally completed through
questionnaires at the end of a ses-
sion—establishes whether participants
liked an activity and believed it to be
worthwhile. It also may include questions
about the comfort level of participants,
such as whether the room was too hot
or too cold.

Level 2: Participants' Learning.
This level focuses on the knowledge
and skills participants gained during the
session. Assessments at this level may
involve a range of activities, from written
responses to questions to demonstration
of newly acquired skills.

**Level 3: Organizational Support
and Change.** This level focuses on

gathering information about whether the
professional development activity was
aligned with the organization's mission
and goals, whether leadership within the
organization publicly supported change,
and whether organization leaders pro-
vided the necessary resources to encour-
age change.

**Level 4: Participants' Use of New
Knowledge and Skills.** This level
focuses on whether participants use what
they have learned. Assessments at this
level must be made after enough time has
passed to allow participants to put their
new skills into practice and may involve
more than one follow up.

**Level 5: Student Learning Out-
comes.** This level focuses on whether
students benefited as a result of the
professional development activities. Mea-
sures at this level depend on the
goal of the activity and may include such
indicators as student grades, scores on
standardized tests, attendance, or class-
room behavior.

California state SIM conference scheduled for June 23-25

KU-CRL, California State University—Bakersfield, and Point Loma Nazarene University will present “Providing Quality Instruction through SIM” in June in Bakersfield, Calif.

The June 23-25 California SIM conference (CAL-SIM) will feature keynote addresses by Jean Schumaker and Mike Hock.

The conference is open to general and special education teachers, administrators, program specialists, SIM Professional Developers, university faculty, educational therapists, and parents.

Preconference July 18-19, 2005

Even though some travel agents will tell you to fly to Topeka, plan to fly to Kansas City International Airport (official FAA abbreviation: “MCI”; known around here as “KCI”). Transportation from KCI to Lawrence is much easier. It is located northeast of Lawrence and is approximately an hour drive from Lawrence. You may want to rent a car or use the transportation services described below. If you are driving from the airport to Lawrence, take I-435 Topeka exit and then I-70 west. Leave the turnpike at the east Lawrence exit if you are staying at SpringHill Suites, the Eldridge Hotel, or the Halcyon House. For other places, the west Lawrence exit is more convenient.

Conference participants qualify for a \$44 discounted **round-trip fare** (regular price is \$55) to and from any site in Lawrence. You must say you want the “**discounted KU-CRL fare**” when making reservations to get this price. Guarantee your reservation with a credit card number, but tell them you will pay with cash to avoid a cancellation fee.

StratePubs

Teaching Adolescents to be Strategic Learners, by Jean Schumaker and Don Deshler, is a comprehensive review of research related to the Strategic Instruction Model.

Instructional Coaches Make Progress through Partnership, by Jim Knight, describes the work of instructional coaches in KU-CRL's Pathways to Success project in Topeka, Kan. The article describes what coaches do, how they are selected, how they learn to do their jobs, and lessons learned from the project.

Reading modules offered

The eight Reading Modules originally developed by KU-CRL's Online Academy are now available at a discount for members of the SIM Network.

The series covers such topics as Overview of Learning Disabilities and Reading Disabilities, Beginning Word Reading, Advanced Word Reading and Developing Reading Fluency, Basic Principles in Reading Comprehension, Building Background Knowledge for Reading Comprehension, and Goal Specific Comprehension Strategies.

Once enrolled, you may complete the

modules at your own pace and on your own schedule. A certificate of completion can be provided.
