Patty Graner, a familiar face in the SIM Network, has taken on a new role, that of KU-CRL director of professional development.

KU-CRL Director Don Deshler made the announcement in early June.

Patty, who assumes her new responsibilities immediately, brings a rich array of experiences as a teacher, administrator, and SIM Professional Developer. She has been a certified member of the network since 1988 and has assumed a host of professional development leadership roles.

She has co-directed KU-CRL's Teaching Content to All institutes for the past several vears and has directed several Potential SIM Professional Development Institutes.

love this!



•I have used LINCS both the learning strategy and the content enhancement routine—with elementary students in small class settings and in tutorial situations.

We use the two middle frames of the CE tables to expand the space for cartooning and stretch the writing along the bottom edge of those two frames.

On the LINCS card, we mark up the vocabulary word using the Orton-based reading method that I teach (Wilson Reading System). This really helps reinforce phonemic awareness, syllabication, and morphology.


