# Say Hello to the Stratepedia Blog & Get to Know Collaborative Technology

*Hello*, the Stratepedia blog, started with relatively small ambitions but has grown into a new source for technology-related news that may affect the Strategic Instruction Model and the work of the Center for Research on Learning.

Hello's roots began in January 2007, when we needed a quick way to let people know what was happening during our unfortunately rocky transition from ContentEnhancement. org to Stratepedia.org. We made it through that transition and continued to use the blog as a means to notify people about software updates and coming service interruptions. However, such events are rare, and the blog sat idle for weeks at a time. Meanwhile, we realized we were finding new tools and concepts that might not have an immediate place in other Center publications but would be of interest to many who work with us. Thus, Hello evolved into a new publication of sorts. But instead of a traditional (paper or e-mail) newsletter, Hello is published using the concept and technology of blogging.

Our goal with *Hello* is to make new technology less scary—whether that be something we've developed or a Web site or product we've stumbled upon and now use ourselves. We'd even like to get you thinking about *why* emerging technologies are important and *how* we can put them to use in support of SIM—and once that interest has been piqued, we want to include you in the discussion.

#### What You'll Find in Hello

You'll find four general types of articles in *Hello*:

*News about Stratepedia stuff:* If we know one of our services will be unavailable for some duration of time, we'll let you know through *Hello.* If you're planning to use Depot for some scheduled professional development, check the blog and avoid surprises!

Tutorials about Stratepedia tools and other technology: We'd love to meet with everyone face-to-face to show off our work and help you use it as effectively as possible, but travel budgets and time constraints keep that from being a reality. These tutorials are the next best thing—not only can you become a Stratepedia pro on your own time, but you also might learn a thing or two about working with video, improving the quality of handouts, or enhancing collaborative efforts.

Links to useful software and Web sites: We're always on the lookout for tools that make our work easier. When we find utilities to make our presentations more professional, Web sites that make delivering our message easier, or nifty collaboration tools, we don't keep them to ourselves—we tell you all about our experiences with them in *Hello*.

Big picture discussions: Technology has had a significant role in the Center's work and perhaps an even larger one in our daily lives. In many ways, it continues to redefine that work, and we want to be ready when that happens. How has the Web changed publishing and dissemination? What is the role of social networking in coaching and professional development? We ask these questions with the hope that you'll share your ideas and concerns about where technology is heading and how that affects the work we do.

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#### Following Along with Hello

*Hello* isn't like a traditional newsletter or magazine—it's updated frequently (sometimes several times a day) and shares comments much more regularly than they'd be shared if we had a "Letters to the Editor" section. However, visiting a Web site every day or week to check on new content is not a productive use of one's time. Luckily, Web 2.0 provides us new ways to keep up with our favorite content providers.

The best way to keep up with new content on *Hello* is to subscribe to our RSS feed (see the box on page 3 to learn more about RSS and why we love it). Links to new articles will generally arrive in your reader within an hour of us posting them to the blog.

If you're not quite ready for RSS, you can keep up-to-date through e-mail. Posts are sent in digest form (once daily) directly to your inbox, so you won't be overwhelmed with new stuff from us. Of course, you can unsubscribe at any time.

#### **Passive Reading Not Allowed!**

The Web is no longer a passive, read-only medium. Every day, new sites like YouTube, Flickr, and Wikipedia crop up, allowing people to share video, images, and ideas. In fact, we rely on your comments and suggestions to make our blog a more useful resource for everyone.

The quickest, easiest way to get involved is to leave your comments. No registration is required—just enter your name, e-mail address (not shared with anybody!), and your thoughts. Blogs are a great way to get conversations started, and we hope we'll touch on a subject about which you've got much to say. Don't be shy about sharing your thoughts or asking us questions! Chances are

if we confused you, we probably confused at least a few dozen others. This is your chance to help us make what we do friendlier to everyone and to make your voice heard by us the 362 days of the year we're not presenting at a conference.

Got a lot to say about collaborative technology in general or the Stratepedia tools in particular? Come on board as a *Hello* contributor. David Gnojek, the Center's graphic designer, did. He now shares tips on making your presentations and printouts look more polished and professional. What kinds of ideas do you have to share with the Center and the SIM Network? Or, if your interests lie outside of *Hello's* scope, why not start a blog of your own? Services like Blogger and WordPress. com are free and easy to set up and use. Within minutes, your blog will be ready to collect your thoughts and share them with the world. It's a great way to promote yourself (not to mention SIM)!

## RSS? Web 2.0? What's that?

Sometimes the vocabulary associated with the Internet can change as rapidly as the information itself. Here are a few keywords you might see.

#### **BLOG**

#### RSS

#### A **blog** is a high-tech version of a journal. Anyone can document important events or share information pertaining to topics such as technology, cooking, children, and more.

**RSS** stands for Really Simple Syndication, a delivery mechanism for Web-based content. Instead of visiting several Web sites to view updated information, you can direct the information to one, personalized site or application.

#### WEB 2.0

**Web 2.0** is a fancy buzz word for the tools and concepts developed to help us all collaborate online. The Internet is far from being stagnant, and this new "version" is referring to the fact that not only are you taking information from the Web, you're now reciprocating your knowledge through tools such as wikis and blogs.

# Two fabulous keynotes

#### Annemarie Sullivan Palincsar

LITERACY

Annemarie Sullivan Palincsar is the Jean and Charles Walgreen Jr. Chair of Reading and Literacy and Arthur F. Thurnau Professor



at the University of Michigan. Her research focuses on the design of learning environments that support self-regulation in learning activity, especially for children who experience difficulty learning in school.

Annemarie completed her doctorate at the Center for the Study of Reading at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana. She has served as a member of a number of national panels and organizations and is co-editor of the journal *Cognition and Instruction* and is a member of the National Academy of Education.

Among her recent publications is Informed Choices for Struggling Adolescent Readers: A Research-Based Guide to Instructional Programs and Practices (2007, Deshler, Palincsar, Biancarosa, & Nair). This book reviews many issues, including myths and misperceptions, associated with adolescent literacy and describes the instructional approach and research base of 48 currently available programs.

### Michael Fullan

EDUCATIONAL CHANGE

M i c h a e l Fullan, professor emeritus of the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education of the University of Toronto, is an international



leader on educational change. He has developed a number of partnerships designed to bring about major school improvements and is engaged in training, consulting, and evaluation of change projects around the world.

Michael and his colleagues have written annotated summaries of what they consider to be the 20 best books on leadership and change, and they have named 10 top web sites for tools, instruments, and ideas for improving change leadership. Both the annotations and the web links are available at www.michaelfullan.ca.

Michael now serves as special advisor to the Premier and Minister of Education in Ontario. His book, *Leading in a Culture of Change*, was awarded the 2002 Book of the Year Award by the National Staff Development Council. In *Turnaround Leadership*, he shows how leaders can convert even the worst situation into an opportunity to rejuvenate their schools.
