Voyage to School Change

Join the next voyage of SIM® as we set a course for school change. The 2010 International SIM Conference will be July 14-16 in Lawrence, Kan. Come a day early to participate in our fabulous preconference workshops on July 13 (see page 5). Registration forms for the conference and preconference are on pages 7 and 8.

We are fortunate to have as our keynote speaker Timothy Shanahan, professor of urban education at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Dr. Shanahan possesses a wealth of expertise in reading instruction and has written or edited 200 publications on the topic. His vast experience includes past positions as director of reading for Chicago Public Schools, president of the International Reading Association, and member of the National Reading Panel, a group convened by the National Institute of

Child Health and Human Development to evaluate research on successful methods of teaching reading. Dr. Shanahan has received many awards for his research and was inducted into the Reading Hall of Fame in 2007. We are honored to have him as our keynote speaker this summer.

Dr. Shanahan's address will help us extend our disciplinary literacy discussions begun last year. Across the country, researchers and practitioners hold many perspectives on what constitutes literacy. How each defines literacy has direct implications for who within a school is responsible for it and what is involved in teaching it. In the September issue of *Stratenotes*, Don Deshler addressed some of these issues and offered examples of the

different definitions of literacy that are in play in today's schools. Rereading the article to refresh your memory would be a good foundation for the work we will be doing in July and the work you do in schools throughout the year.

A common message running throughout every conference session will be the answer to "How does this information fit into a tiered instruction model?" Presenters will make explicit connections between the material they are presenting and the tiers of a response-to-intervention-type model or the levels of the Content Literacy Continuum.


In their article, Barb and Don define both CLC and RTI and then illustrate how CLC can be a framework for implementing RTI in secondary schools. The draft of the article is available on the conference web site.

STRANDS

After the keynote address, we'll break into five "strands" for the rest of the day. These intense, daylong sessions allow you to think deeply about SIM, the needs of educators today, and your role in bringing about lasting school change.

We developed the strand format last year in response to years of feedback asking for more time for thorough study of topics important to SIM Professional Developers. Strand topics and content were selected based on the changing nature of the work we do, especially as it relates to literacy. Four of last year's strands will be repeated, with updated content as appropriate, and we've added a new strand for 2010. Each will include activities developed to supplement discussion as well as time for you to discuss implications with your colleagues and gain deeper understandings through shared perspectives. By the end of the day, you will have developed a solid understanding of the strand's

subject, and you will feel confident discussing related issues with others as you go about your professional development work.

We will post an online survey this spring to gauge your interest in these strands. This is very important. In this survey, we will ask you to rank

the strands in the order you are most interested in attending. We will use the results of this survey to help us make room assignments. The strands that have the greatest interest—as reflected in the survey results—will be assigned to larger rooms. This does not mean that you are locked in to a choice you make on the survey. You should make your choices during the conference based on what makes the most sense for you and your work. We just ask that you think carefully about the benefits of each strand before making your choice on the

survey and understand that these choices do affect accommodations during the conference. It is very important that you participate in this survey when we announce that it is posted. Watch *Stratenotes* and Twitter (@StrateTweets) for announcements about this and other conference surveys.

Affinity groups, another popular feature in 2009, will return again this year, too. We will reserve time on Friday morning for small groups of professional developers to discuss topics of personal interest. Last year,

groups used the time to discuss such issues as becoming independent professional developers, preservice, and RTI. Some project teams or individuals from the same district met as affinity groups to plan how to use what they had learned during the conference in the coming school year. The conference starts early at http:// sim2010.kucrl.org. We have set up the site as a place to begin conversations and professional learning months before we get together face to face. During the next six months leading up to the big show, visit the site often to help us plan session content and to get answers to any questions you have before you arrive in Lawrence. As many of you know, we changed the conference format last year so that we now spend almost the entire first day in a "strand" focusing on specific content. Because of this change, you will need to make an important choice on the first morning of the conference: which strand will be of most benefit to you and your work? The information available ahead of time on the web site will help you make this choice, and you will be glad you took the time to study it before the conference starts.

What's New in The Big Four

Jim Knight, Director, Kansas Coaching Project, KU-CRL

The Big Four is a set of tools that instructional coaches can use as they work with teachers. The tools fall into four main categories: managing classroom behavior, implementing formative assessment, enhancing content knowledge, and improving direct instruction. Participants will receive a notebook of materials and *Coaching Classroom Management* by Randy Sprick, Jim Knight, Wendy Reinke, and Tricia McKale.

MORNING SESSIONS

Computerized Writing Strategy Instruction

Jean Schumaker and Lisa Walsh, Edge Enterprises

Some students just do not have the prerequisite skills for the *Error Monitoring Strategy*, and others have not learned the complex rules for capitalization and punctuation required on their state competency exams and college entrance exams. This session will focus on three computerized programs for teaching strategies associated with capitalization rules, comma rules, and other punctuation rules. Participants will learn about the strategies themselves and will try

out the programs on their computers. (Please remember to bring a laptop if you have one!) Participants also will learn how to provide workshops on the programs and instruct teachers on their roles in using the computerized instruction format. Participants will receive three CDs and handouts.

Enhancing Content Enhancement Routines: Guidebooks on Integrating CE Routines into Core and Elective Classes

Suzanne M. Robinson and Beverly Colombo, Strategic Learning Center 8 a.m.-noon • Registration fee: \$140

General education teachers often ask to see examples of Content Enhancement devices designed for the courses they teach. The five supplemental Enhancing Content Enhancement Routines guidebooks were created to provide quality examples and more. Four guidebooks address the four main core content areas: math, social studies, science, and English/language arts. A fifth guidebook addresses elective classes. Each guidebook contains a list of courses in the discipline and descriptive information about the courses; national standards for the content area; a list of critical concepts addressed in the discipline and in specific courses; information about text structure, knowledge structures, and ways of thinking in the discipline; examples of course maps and their units with integrated Content Enhancement devices; and information about assessment of critical content and examples of formative and summative assessments that align with the CE devices. This session will introduce professional developers to the supplemental guidebooks and provide professional development ideas and support material. Participants will engage in activities developed from teaching suggestions. Participants will receive five Content Enhancement disciplinespecific supplement guidebooks and their accompanying CDs plus a CD containing professional development PowerPoints.

Science and Social Studies Essential Understandings SMARTsheets

This workshop will focus on how to apply genre-specific SMARTsheets for science and for social studies. Science SMARTsheets target essential understandings associated with each of the National Science Education Standards curriculum standards' thematic strands (systems, order, and organization; evidence, models, and explanation, etc.). Social studies SMARTsheets target National Council for Social Studies thematic strands (time, continuity and change; people, places, and environment, etc.). The EDIT Strategy, which includes content from the Error Monitoring Strategy and the InSPECT Strategy, is designed to help students detect and correct spelling and mechanical errors in their writing produced using a word processing program. In addition to error correction, the strategy includes editing for meaning and adding additional content elaboration. This in-depth workshop will give registrants an opportunity to learn about the strategy, how it was developed, and the research behind it and will provide opportunities

to practice with the materials. This workshop will be especially beneficial for new professional developers or those who want an in-depth, hands-on experience with professional development techniques. Participants will receive the *EDIT Strategy* manual and CD.

Literature Literacy SMARTsheets

Edwin Ellis, University of Alabama 1-5 p.m. • Registration fee: \$60

This workshop will focus on how to apply Literature Literacy SMARTsheets to enhance comprehension of and ability to write about literature. SMARTsheets are graphic organizerlike devices with embedded semantic prompts designed to cue students to engage in specific information processing strategies and thinking skills and to focus on what is essential to understand about a set of high-frequency generative topics commonly addressed in literature. We will be examining specific SMARTsheets for story grammar and sequence, analysis of story-problems, characters, poems, speeches, literacy devices, and literary themes, as well as SMARTsheets designed to promote use of questioning, making inferences, summarizing, and predicting cognitive strategies. A portion of the session will be allocated to how to use professional development resources when working with teachers. Participants should bring a laptop computer loaded with Adobe Reader and Microsoft Word and samples of literature (books, stories) and typical assignments that address literature your students commonly encounter. Participants will receive a copy of the Literature Essential Understandings SMARTsheets software and a CD containing a range of professional development resources. Call for Proposals

We are pleased to announce the call for proposals for the International SIM Conference for SIM Professional Developers. **The deadline for proposal submission is March 15, 2010.** Submit your proposal by e-mailing Mona Tipton at mkatz@ku.edu.

To save trees and to aid in distribution, electronic handouts will be required of all presenters. Handouts will be posted online for our participants to download in advance.

Selected presenters will be notified by April 1, 2010. By submitting a proposal, presenters are providing consent for themselves and all other presenters on the proposal to be videotaped. Your submission of a proposal constitutes a commitment by all individuals participating in the presentation to register for the conference if the proposal is accepted. Registration must be received by July 1, 2010.

Types of Proposals

A: "Tips, Tools, and Practical Ideas" Enlightening Rounds: 10-minute presentations relevant to professional development in Content Enhancement, Learning Strategies, Instructional Coaching, Technology, or Preservice Education. Speakers will take turns presenting to the audience. Presentations should focus on specific tips, tools, and practical implementation ideas. Proposals should include the title of the presentation and a short summary of the presentation, which should include a description of the subject, settings in which it may be used, and evidence of results, if available. An LCD projector, chart paper, and pens will be provided.

B: Book Report Pecha-kucha: Presenters will report on books selected by the Center and relevant to SIM professional development work. The purpose is to whet the audience's appetite to read the book. The pecha-kucha technique requires brief and focused presentations. It liberates the presenter from feeling obligated to include an overabundance of information by limiting the number of slides used in a presentation and the time spent on each slide. Each presenter will use 20 PowerPoint slides. The slideshow will be set to change the slide every 20 seconds. Slides will progress automatically. This provides for a 6 minute and 40 second presentation. Presenters will create a bookmark-handout summarizing these points using a template provided by KU-CRL. Slides must be submitted to mkatz@ku.edu **by June 20, 2010**. For more information on pecha-kucha, go to http://www.pecha-kucha.org.

C: Mini Pearls: 20-minute presentations relevant to professional development in Content Enhancement, Learning Strategies, Instructional Coaching, Technology, or Preservice Education. Proposals should include **the title of the presentation** and **a short summary of the presentation.** This summary should include a description of the subject of the presentation, including any evidence of results, if available. An LCD projector, chart paper, and pens will be provided.

D: Poster Session: This session will showcase research or innovation in SIM. Proposals should include **the title of the poster and a short (50 or fewer words) abstract for use in the program book.** In addition, if applicable, also include a short description of the evidence of any results. If you want to use a KU-CRL trifold board or if you will require an electrical outlet, please include that request in your proposal. Participants who want to use a laptop must provide their own laptop.

This class will enable preservice educators in teacher education programs to provide empirically validated SIM interventions to prospective teachers. This class will focus on exploring strategies from the SIM Learning Strategies Curriculum. Participants will explore several learning strategies and will be provided sample syllabi, books, and teaching resources that can be used to modify existing courses or construct new courses.

Teaching Content to All: Effective College Teaching

This class, which is designed for college/university faculty who are engaged in teacher preparation, will enable participants to implement a variety of empirically validated teaching routines from the SIM Content Enhancement (CE) Series. Con-

tent will emphasize inclusive course planning and the implementation of a variety of explicit teaching routines designed to ensure content-area mastery of critical ideas and concepts by all students. Participants will explore several routines in depth so that CE Routines can be infused into existing courses or new courses can be constructed. Information related to meeting additional SIM CE Inservice Professional Developer certification requirements will be provided. Teams of individuals from the same institution are encouraged to enroll.

FOR CLASSROOM TEACHERS

SIM Reading and Writing Strategies

This class is directed toward teachers who work directly with students. Teachers will be introduced to the foundations of SIM Learning Strategies and will receive instruction on implementing research-based interventions to help students acquire the skills necessary to understand grade-level reading materials. Class

participants learn how to implement the Word Identification Strategy, Paraphrasing Strategy, LINCs Vocabulary Strategy, and Fundamentals and Proficiency in the Sentence Writing Strategy. Time will be allowed for planning for implementation.

In addition to reading and writing strategies, selections may include strategies related to studying and remembering information, improving assignments, and motivation.

Introduction to Teaching with Content Enhancement

In this class, teachers learn methods to teach large amounts of content to academically diverse classes in "learner-friendly" ways without diluting the content. Participants will plan how to use Content Enhancement (CE) Routines in their own courses to enhance the way they present subject-area content and improve students' ability to organize, understand, and remember critical information. CE Routines include ways to plan courses, units, and lessons; teach the mastery of concepts; promote the understanding of reading assignments; teach the mastery of the meaning of vocabulary words; guide the development of answers to critical questions; and support understanding and remembering key information. General and special education teachers will find this class relevant and stimulating.

FOR ADMINISTRATORS

SIM for Administrators
