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Web appeal

Center launches redesigned, restructured site

The Center for Research on Learning has undergone some important changes in the past few months—on our web site, that is. The Center's redesigned home page (http://kucrl. org) launched at the end of January, and already we are hearing great reviews. A big thank you to **David Gnojek**, the Center's art director, who took on the mammoth redesign task.

We set out to accomplish several goals with the redesign:

- 1. Comply with new University of Kansas web design requirements. Because we are a unit of the university, some elements of our site are dictated by KU's expectations for university web sites. The graphic of the hill across the top of the page, the references to KU Home and Kyou, and the gray bar at the bottom of the page containing KU-specific links are elements of the KU web design template.
- 2. Equally represent all CRL divisions. Feedback indicated our previous web design made it difficult to find links to the Center's divisions: ALTEC, Division of



Adult Studies, e-Learning Design Lab, Institute for Research on Adolescent Learning, Kansas Coaching Project, and Professional Development Research Institute. The new design lists all six divisions alphabetically on the lower left side of the page, under the featured content. Each division name is linked to the division's own web site.

- 3. **Improve navigation and organization.** The main section of the new home page features prominent links to five high-traffic sections of the site:
 - The **ABOUT** section describes our

- mission and goals and provides contact information for the Center and for central office staff members
- The RESEARCH section lists journal articles by Center researchers (both an alphabetical listing and a category listing, as on the previous site)
- The CLASSES & CONFERENCES section lists classes, conferences, and events sponsored by our divisions; details are available by clicking on the event name
- The **PRESENTATIONS** section con-

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
tains slideshows and handouts from select presentations made by the Center's researchers

 The MULTIMEDIA section contains video, graphics, podcasts, and photos produced by the Center

The central part of the home page now features a news slide show. Content in this section will be updated frequently and will include links to profiles of projects conducted by Center researchers. A profile of Soaring to New Heights, for example, describes the successes, challenges, and lessons learned in this Division of Adult Studies project. Our goal is to post at least one new project profile each month, along with news as it happens.

As you are exploring our redesigned site, note several helpful links near the bottom of the page. Just above the Jayhawk graphic you will find text links to SIMville, StrateReaders, and Stratedirectory Online on the left side of the page. On the right side are icon links to an RSS feed (which will notify you when news items are posted), to our @kucrl Twitter account, and to our YouTube channel.

With all of these changes to the main CRL site, you may be wondering about Strategic Instruction Model® information.

We have not changed the SIM section of the site yet. With one exception (see TIP above), all of our SIM

information remains where it was before the main site redesign. We are in the process of analyzing the current content and organization as we prepare to give SIM a site of its very own. For now, you can still find SIM at http://kucrl.org/sim. This address will change slightly when we launch the redesigned SIM site in a couple of months. We will announce the new address here and through the @StrateTweets Twitter account, and the old page will redirect visitors to the new address for awhile.

Voyage to School Change

We are fortunate to have as our keynote speaker Timothy Shanahan, professor of urban education at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Dr. Shanahan possesses a wealth of expertise in reading instruction and has written or edited 200 publications on the topic. Reading assignment

During this year's conference, we will continue our exploration of disciplinary literacy. Across the country, researchers and practitioners hold many perspectives on what constitutes literacy. How each defines literacy has direct implications for who within a school is responsible for it and what is involved in teaching it.

Two articles available on the conference web site will help you prepare for these discussions:

- Rethinking SIM, Literacy, and Professional Development, by Don Deshler.
- Using the Content Literacy Continuum® as a Framework for Implementing RTI in Secondary Schools, by Barb Ehren and Don Deshler.
