

Recent publications from KUCRL

In the past year, KUCRL researchers have published several articles and book chapters that add to our discussions of adolescent literacy and tiered intervention programs. This issue of *Stratenotes* previews just a few of the articles that you may find useful in your work.

Several recent articles look at different aspects of adolescent literacy. From a big picture perspective, Don Deshler, Mike Hock, Frances Ihle, and Carrie Mark wrote a chapter for the *Handbook of Reading Research, Volume IV*, describing features and trends in literacy research in school settings. They also discuss implications for theory, practice, policy, and research.

Mike Faggella-Luby and Patty Graner review typical reading development and present critical components of comprehension instruction for adolescent struggling readers in a chapter in *Literacy and Learning (Advances in Learning and Behavioral Disabilities, Volume 23)*. The chapter also discusses schoolwide structures—including response to

intervention and the Content Literacy Continuum®—and describes research findings related to two example interventions, the *Embedded Story Structure Routine* and the *Written Summarization Strategy*.

Don and Michael Kennedy present a conceptual framework for multimedia instructional design in “Literacy Instruction, Technology, and Students with Learning Disabilities: Research We Have, Research We Need,” published in *Learning Disability Quarterly*. They make recommendations for integrating multimedia literacy instruction in RTI frameworks and identify areas in need of further research.

Mike Hock and Daryl Mellard extended SIM research into adult literacy settings and report their findings in the *Journal of Research on Educational Effectiveness*. Their randomized controlled study taught four Learning Strategies (Bridging, Building Fluency, Prediction, and Summarization) to adult basic education participants. The study found no significant differences in results between experimental and

control groups, and Mike and Daryl reflect on possible reasons, including insufficient dosage and differences in the structure of adult education programs compared to secondary settings.

Another set of articles looked at the Content Literacy Continuum® and tiered instruction. Barbara Ehren, Don, and Patty examined how the five levels of CLC align with three- or four-tiered response to intervention programs. Their article in *Theory into Practice* discusses why CLC is useful as a framework for designing RTI programs.

Jean Schumaker and Don discuss how to integrate research-based interventions into a schoolwide framework for improving the academic performance of secondary students. Their chapter in *Interventions for Achievement and Behavior Problems in a Three-Tier Model Including RTI* draws extensively on SIM and CLC research and summarizes several SIM studies.

Daryl, Melinda McKnight, and Joanna Jordan describe 10 dimensions of intervention intensity in a response-to-intervention framework.

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Their article in *Learning Disabilities Research & Practice* reports data related to some of those dimensions from a study of 41 schools.

Who has the *Write Stuff*? We do. Steve Graham does. And you will, too, if you join us in July for the 2011 International SIM® Conference

The 2011 International SIM® Conference continues our in-depth exploration of issues in literacy and education as they relate to the work that we all do within the International Professional Development Network. This year, writing skills and instruction and related professional development issues take top billing.

Steve Graham will draw on his extensive knowledge about writing and adolescent learning when he presents our keynote address, *Why We Must Teach Writing and How To Do It Effectively*. Graham, professor and Currey Ingram Chair in Special Education and Literacy at Vanderbilt University, is co-author of *Writing Next: Effective Strategies to Improve Writing of Adolescents in Middle and High Schools* (Alliance for Excellent Education, 2007) and *Writing to Read: Evidence for How Writing Can Improve Reading* (2010, Alliance for Excellent Education). We highly recommend you read them to prepare for the conference.

2011 keynote address:

Why We Must Teach Writing and How To Do It Effectively

This presentation first will examine why writing is critical to youngsters' school, social, and occupational success. It then will explore evidence-based practices that are effective at Tier 1 (regular classroom instruction) and beyond.

The strand format of the past two years returns in a slightly altered form. Strands are longer, tightly focused sessions designed to allow you to delve deeply into a topic.

In keeping with our *Write Stuff* theme, two of the strands will be specifically related to writing: *Content Enhancement and Writing*, led by Jan Bulgren and Keith Lenz, and *Learning Strategies and Writing*, led by Jean Schumaker. The other strands represent three important aspects of our work. *School Change and the CLC* recognizes the sense of urgency

for educators to find ways to create changes in schools that will result in high levels of performance by all students. *Strengthen Your SIM Core* will explore knowledge, techniques, activities, and tools to strengthen you and your work as a SIM Professional Developer. *Designing Professional Learning to Have an Unmistakeable Impact*, led by Jim Knight, describes high-leverage activities educational leaders can employ to design professional learning that has an unmistakable impact on teaching. You will

Other opportunities for professional learning during the conference will introduce you to new materials, prompt you to discuss what it means to foster effective literacy leadership, and guide you through a look at the expanding role of technology in our professional development work. We also will hear from practitioners who have SIM success stories to share as well as from SIM Professional Developers who are doing innovative things in their work.

In *The Right Stuff*, Tom Wolfe's 1979 examination of the adventures of post-World War II test pilots and early astronauts, the "right stuff" was a combination of bravery and bravado, mental and physical toughness, and drive to be the best. In 2011, the *Write Stuff* means having the knowledge and professional development tools to help teachers provide effective writing instruction so they can help students achieve new heights as writers and as literate individuals.
