Celebrating & exploring SIM connections

Encompass, the 2012 International SIM Conference, will celebrate the spectrum of connections that have made the Strategic Instruction Model an enduring fixture on the education landscape. SIM, never a single solution to problems of learning and instruction, has expanded significantly over the years as our research and that of others unveils new best practices.

Take, for example, the two keynote speakers we have booked for the conference. Both Ed Ellis and Jim Knight have made contributions to research and practice that have pushed SIM into new territory.

Ellis, professor of special education and multiple abilities at the University of Alabama, is the author of the Clarifying Routine, Framing Routine, LINCS Vocabulary Strategy, Vocabulary LINCing Routine, and SLANT: A Starter Strategy for Class Participation. He is also president of Makes Sense Strategies LLC.

His keynote address, *Beyond Test Scores—Indices of a Successful Education*, will focus on instructional prac-

tices and 10 indicators of a successful education.

Knight, director of the Kansas Coaching Project at KUCRL, is an author of the *Fundamentals of Paraphrasing and Summarizing* manual and is well known for his work involving instructional coaching. He is the author of several books on instructional coaching, including *Instructional Coaching: A Partnership Approach to Improving Instruction* and *Unmistakable Impact: A Partnership Approach for Dramatically Improving Instruction*.

His keynote address, *Learning Adults for Learning Students*, will explore the benefits of and the practices that promote professional learning.

Together, the insights of our keynote speakers will prompt all of us to consider new thinking and new understanding in relation to our work with SIM. If you think of our work as a compass, the kind used in mathematics or drafting to draw circles and arcs, one piece remains firmly embedded in the research from which SIM emerged. As our understanding of issues in education and adolescent literacy grows, we open the hinge to admit new knowledge and solutions into our circle. Ellis and Knight are both grounded in SIM, but their research paths have taken them in new directions and to new discoveries that expand the circle of our SIM knowledge.

New schedule

As you're making your plans to attend the conference, note that our schedule is significantly different from past years. We hope the new Tuesday-to-Thursday schedule will ease some of the travel and lodging issues associated with attending the conference, allowing participants to fly in Monday evening or Tuesday morning and stay for the entire conference. Our goal is to create a schedule that is conducive to your full participation in conference events.

The conference will begin with our first keynote at noon on Tuesday, July 10, followed by an afternoon of breakout sessions. The conference will continue on Wednesday, July 11, with our second keynote leading off the day.

If you have attended an interna-

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tional conference in the last few years, you will recognize the strand format, planned for Wednesday morning and Thursday morning (July 12). Strands are extended sessions, designed to allow you enough time for in-depth learning centered on a single topic. This year's strands will delve into connections between SIM and current issues in education, including many states' adoption of the Common Core State Standards.

Jan Bulgren will lead an interactive thinking and planning strand to collaboratively answer questions about CCSS and Content Enhancement Routines. Participants are encouraged to bring texts, assessments, district guidelines, and other materials to use in devising concrete answers to such questions as "What are the higher-order thinking demands in CCSS?" and "What Content Enhancement Routines specifically respond to those demands?"

Last year, Don Deshler's strand used case studies to discuss the challenges of changing school culture. We expect his strand this year, on literacy and school change, to be just as dynamic and productive.

Keynote: Beyond Test Scores: Indices of a Successful Education

Given common educational practices and pressures wrought by policy makers who define success by test scores, is it any wonder that many struggling learners have motivation issues? This keynote presentation will examine a broader definition of what constitutes a meaningful education and will explore instructional practices that impair and those that support the development of 10 indices of success.

For instructional coaches or those interested in a deeper understanding of coaching, Jim Knight's strand will explore issues that put professional learning and coaching in focus.

Learning Strategies professional developers will not want to miss Jean Schumaker's strand connecting research, current educational trends (such as Common Core State Standards), and best practices.

The conference will wrap up with breakout sessions followed by Don Deshler's traditional closing address on Thursday afternoon.

Keynote: Learning Adults for Learning Students



Jim Knight

For more than three decades, KUCRL has studied and promoted the importance of learning. Our view has always been that children have a much greater chance of succeeding if they learn how to learn. As we have studied professional learning, we have come to a second conclusion: Children have a much better chance of succeeding if the adults who teach them continue to be learners.

Fortunately, research has identified simple practices that

stand at the heart of personal and organizational learning. During this session, you'll hear stories that illustrate each practice and learn how those practices are inherent to the professional learning processes of instructional coaching, impact schools, partnership learning, and intensive learning teams that have been developed at KUCRL over more than a decade of research. Finally, you'll hear how those processes can be employed to promote widespread adoption and deep implementation of SIM.

Creating an Impact School: Professional Learning that Makes a Difference

Presenter: Jim Knight, KUCRL **Registration fee:** \$90

This workshop describes high-leverage activities educational leaders can employ to design professional learning that has an unmistakable impact on teaching. The content of the session draws from ideas described in Jim Knight's *Unmistakable Impact* and is based on more than 18 years of research on professional learning conducted at the Kansas Coaching Project at the University of Kansas Center for Research on Learning.

This session will describe how schools and districts can focus their professional learning on easy-to-understand professional learning targets; how workshops, professional learning communities and other forms of professional learning can support implementation of school improvement targets; what principals, coaches, and central office staff need to do to accelerate professional learning; and what teaching practices have the greatest effect in the classroom. The session will address the following questions:

- Which teaching practices have the greatest effect on teaching excellence and student achievement?
- What are the complexities of helping relationships?

Minimum registration for each session is 10 participants. We will cancel any session that does not have at least 10 participants registered by June 1.

Participants should bring their own laptop computers to preconference sessions.

- What is the partnership approach and why is it an essential foundation for professional learning?
- Why is an instructional target important?
- What are the step-by-step procedures leaders can follow to create school improvement targets?
- How can leaders best get schoolwide commitment to implementing the target?
- How can principals best lead and support implementation of the school improvement target?
- How should workshops, intensive learning teams, and other forms of professional learning be designed to ensure impact on student learning and teacher practice?
- How can instructional coaches be best used to support professional learning?
- How should central office and school leaders work together successfully to support professional learning that makes an impact?

SIM & Common Core State Standards

Common Core State Standards, adopted by all but a few states, have become a big topic of conversation in the education world. The standards weave reading and writing expectations throughout the curriculum, in all subjects at all grade levels.

We are offering two classes this spring to help classroom teachers understand connections between SIM and the Common Core State Standards and, ultimately, to better enable students to meet the increased reading and writing demands they face. Both classes will be held April 16-19 in Lawrence, Kan.

SIM Reading and Writing Strategies and the Common Core State Standards is for middle school and high school teachers who are charged with providing powerful reading and writing strategies that support the Common Core State Standards and promote student success. The class will introduce participants to the foundations of SIM and will teach *Proficiency in the Sentence Writing Strategy, the LINCS Vocabulary*

Strategy, the Inference Strategy, and Fundamentals of Paraphrasing and Summarizing. Participants will have time to plan how to use the strategies with their students.

SIM Content Enhancement Routines and the Common Core State Standards will introduce teachers to a selection of routines from the Content Enhancement Series. Participants will learn about and plan how to implement the following routines in their own classrooms: Course Organizer Routine, Unit Organizer Routine, Concept Mastery Routine, and Question Exploration Routine. Teachers who use these routines will better prepare their students to meet the literacy and higher-order thinking demands they face in the classroom.
