


SIM Stats 2013

Thanks to all SIM Professional Developers who submitted reports of professional development sessions during 2013. Your reports help us understand the state of the Strategic Instruction Model[™] across the country and around the world. This issue of *Stratenotes* presents a snapshot based on SIM reports submitted January–December, 2013.

Thanks to Peony Allen, who tracks all of the information you submit.



Of the 404 sessions reported in 2013, Florida took top honors for number of sessions reported by state or region with 85, followed by Virginia (66) and Texas (45). This compares to 2012 reports for Virginia (90), Florida (49), and Georgia (38). In addition to sessions within the United States, SIM Professional Developers presented SIM sessions in China (3) and Canada, Colombia, and Israel (1 each). See page 3 for a complete list. SIM Professional Developers presented strategies and routines 534 times in 2013. The top five were Fundamentals in the Sentence Writing Strategy (81), Proficiency in the Sentence Writing Strategy (72), Unit Organizer Routine (46), Framing Routine (33), and Paraphrasing Strategy (32). Do you come for the food? No. How about the heat and humidity

that is July in Kansas? No. (No?) The laugh-a-minute nonstop entertainment and frivolity? The chance to rub elbows with celebrities? No.

What the International SIM Conference has to offer is so much more enticing than any of those things: The opportunity to hone your professional development skills, deepen your understanding of the Strategic Instruction ModelTM and school improvement issues, and make or renew friendships with like-minded individuals who are part of this crazy thing we call the SIM International Professional Development Network.

The 2014 conference will be July 16–18 in Lawrence, Kan., and plans are starting to come together. Mark your calendars and keep an eye on *Stratenotes*, where we'll announce conference details as we finalize them.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS

One detail that is final, and exciting, is that our keynote speaker will be Cynthia E. Coburn, professor at the School of Education and Social Policy, Northwestern University.

Coburn's 2003 piece, "Rethinking Scale: Moving Beyond Numbers to Deep and Lasting Change," resonates with us in that the issues she discusses are those with which we have wrestled in our efforts to get SIM into the hands of students and teachers.

In the article, Coburn argues that definitions of scale that focus solely on counting the number of schools in which a reform has been implemented are insufficient. Instead, she proposes a definition consisting of

four interrelated dimensions: depth, sustainability, spread, and shift in reform ownership.

In another recent piece, Coburn examined types of research-practice partnerships, potential struggles associated with partnerships, and ways to overcome such obstacles to foster successful, productive relationships in work toward education improvement.

Given her research history, Coburn's keynote address is sure to offer insightful and relevant ideas that we can apply to the challenges we meet in working with and within schools.

Call for Proposals

International SIM Conference • July 16–18, 2014 Oread Hotel • Lawrence, Kan.

We are soliciting proposals for presentations for the 2014 International SIM Conference. **The deadline for proposal submission is March 15, 2014.** Submit your proposal by emailing Mona Tipton at monatipton@ku.edu. Selected presenters will be notified by April 2, 2014. By submitting a proposal, presenters are providing consent for themselves and all other presenters on the proposal to be videotaped. Your submission of a proposal constitutes a commitment by all individuals participating in the presentation to register for the conference if the proposal is accepted. Registration must be received by July 1, 2014.

Presenters who want to make handouts available for participants will be required to submit handouts electronically in advance of the conference. Handouts will be posted online for our participants to download.

Types of Proposals

Book Reports: Presenters will report on books selected by the Center that are relevant to SIM professional development work. Presenters have the option of presenting during the Kaleidoscope Session (see information below) or the Poster Session. These reports are designed to present key points and whet the audience's appetite to read the book. Each presenter will create a bookmark handout summarizing key points using a template provided by KUCRL.

Kaleidoscope Session: This session is your opportunity to share SIM research, classroom or professional development activities, innovations, successes, and more in short, smallgroup presentations on Friday morning. Kaleidoscope presentations will be eight minutes long and will be repeated three times. Presenters will be stationed at tables, and audience members will have the opportunity to choose to hear three different presentations. Kaleidoscope proposals should include the **title of the presentation** and a **short abstract (up to 75 words)** for use on the conference website. Presenters who want to use a laptop must provide their own. If you will require an electrical outlet, please include that request in your proposal. Note that if you want to provide a handout for this session, you must provide it as an electronic file. Handouts will be posted online for participants to download.

Poster Session: This session will showcase research or innovation in SIM. Proposals should include **the title of the poster** and **a short abstract (up to 75 words)** for use on the conference website. In addition, if applicable, include a short description of the evidence of any results. If you want to use a KUCRL trifold board or if you will require an electrical outlet, please include that request in your proposal. Participants who want to use a laptop must provide their own.

2013–2014 SIM Virtual Conference

Registration is open for the 2013–2014 SIM virtual conference spring session, scheduled for **April 21–May 12, 2014**, with a mandatory concluding webinar at 4 p.m. (Central) May 14 or 10 a.m. May 15. Registration deadline is April 11, 2014.

Attendance at one of the webinars is mandatory to receive update credit, so please do not sign up for a virtual update if you are not able to attend one of the webinars.

WHAT IS THE SIM VIRTUAL CONFERENCE?

The virtual conference is a way for you to receive credit for attending a SIM update without traveling to the international conference or one of the regional update conferences. It does not replace face-to-face conferences, however. You may attend one virtual conference every four years, and you must attend at least one face-to-face conference between virtual conferences.

HOW MUCH DOES THE VIRTUAL CONFERENCE COST?

The cost is \$400 for the streaming video option or \$425 if you opt to receive DVDs of the sessions. You will not have the travel and lodging costs associated with attending a face-to-face conference. See the registration form on page 8.
