SIM Workshop Opportunities

Pedagogies for Academic Diversity in Secondary Schools Workshop for Preservice Educators

May 26-30, 1998 (Tuesday-Saturday)

Fee: \$510

This workshop is designed for college/ university faculty involved in teacher education programs preparing teachers primarily responsible for large group content-area instruction in the general education middle- and high-school settings. This workshop will enable faculty to prepare teachers to implement a variety of empirically validated teaching routines from the SIM Content Enhancement Series. Content will emphasize inclusive course planning and the implementation of a variety of explicit teaching routines designed to ensure content area mastery of critical ideas and concepts. Participants will explore several routines in depth and will be provided with sample syllabi, books, and teaching resources so that Content Enhancement Routines can be infused into existing courses or new courses can be constructed. Information related to meeting additional SIM Content Enhancement Trainer certification requirements for inservice training will be provided. The workshop is conducted by a team of university faculty from five diverse universities. Teams of individuals from the same institution are encouraged to apply. Applications are due by April 1,

Strategic Instruction Model Workshop Level I

July 21-25, 1998 (Tuesday-Saturday) Fee: \$395

Teachers who have had no training in SIM or perhaps have been trained in only one or two strategies will benefit from this week. During the five days of training, teachers will become familiar with the Overview of Content Enhancement and will become prepared to implement one Content Enhancement Routine and the following strategies: SLANT, Paraphrasing, Sentence Writing, Word Identification, Self Advocacy, and FIRST-Letter Mnemonics. Registration is due by May 8, 1998.

Strategic Instruction Model Workshop Level II

July 21-25, 1998 (Tuesday-Saturday)

Fee: \$395

This workshop will provide training for classroom teachers who already have been trained in SIM procedures and have taught some of the strategies. At this advanced session, participants may choose to enroll in the Writing Strategies (Sentence Writing, Error Monitoring, Paragraph Writing, Theme Writing), Reading Strategies (Paraphrasing, Dissect, Visual Imagery, Self-Questioning), other strategies (Vocabulary, Memory, Assignment Completion), the Content Enhancement Routines, or a combination of several routines and strategies. Teachers will make their selections and submit these with their completed registration form and payment for the workshop. Registration is due by May 8, 1998.

Strategic Instruction Model Workshop Content Enhancement

July 21-25, 1998 (Tuesday-Saturday) Fee: \$395

This workshop is designed to provide an opportunity for teachers to learn new methods to teach large amounts of content to academically diverse classes in "learner friendly" ways. In this hands-on workshop, participants will plan how to use the Content

Preconference to focus on innovative training skills

For trainers interested in opportunities to explore topics in depth, we have set aside a day dedicated to learning new training techniques and practicing skills. Two preconference workshops, focused on innovative staff development strategies, are planned for Wednesday, July 8. The cost for the full day is \$30; half day is \$20. Both prices include a buffet lunch.

The morning will kick off at 8:30 a.m. with Jim Knight leading a session on Partnership Learning, a research-

validated way for SIM Trainers to present information so that teachers and trainers are equal partners in the learning that takes place. During this hands-on workshop, participants will learn the principles and strategies (stories, thinking devices, discussion devices, experiential learning, cooperative learning, and question recipes) of Partnership Learning and then explore ways to use the strategies during training. Enhancement Routines developed at the Center for Research on Learning to enhance the ways they present content and improve students' ability to organize, understand, and remember critical information. Participants will learn all the routines from the Content Enhancement series (Concept Mastery, Anchoring, and Comparison; Lesson, Unit, and Course Organizers; Survey, Clarifying, and Quality Assignment) and then invent ways to implement the routines in their courses. Registration is due by May 8, 1998.

Workshop for Potential SIM Content Enhancement Trainers

July 21-25, 1998 (Tuesday-Saturday)

Fee: \$510

Participants in this workshop will be selected through an application process. Individuals who have previously been trained in and have successfully implemented a variety of Content Enhancement Routines will be trained to begin the process of becoming a Content Enhancement Trainer. To become a certified SIM Content Enhancement Trainer, individuals will be expected to meet additional training requirements after completing the

workshop. Applications will be accepted from individuals who have administrator support and can submit a portfolio of teaching devices showing implementation of a variety of teaching routines throughout a course. Routines are not taught during the workshop; the focus is on the training process. Applications should be postmarked by April 10, 1998.

Workshop for Potential SIM Learning Strategy Trainers

Aug. 3-7, 1998 (Monday-Friday)

Fee: \$510

Participants in this workshop will be selected through an application process. Individuals who have been trained in the Learning Strategies Curriculum and have implemented a variety of learning strategies will be trained to be potential trainers. Teachers need to have implemented at least four strategies; supervisors and coordinators must have implemented at least two strategies with at least one student. Strategies are not taught at the workshop. The focus is on the training process. To become a certified trainer, a set of requirements must be met after the week of training. Applications should be postmarked by April 10, 1998. (RL)

other resources they will need to thoroughly restructure the way they train a learning strategy or Content Enhancement Routine.

Beginning at 1:30 p.m., Mike Hoch and preconference participants will explore "Learning from Students in SIM Workshops."

Although modeling instruction of SIM strategies and routines is an effective way to help teachers prepare for classroom implementation, often it is not enough to ensure that teachers have attained instructional proficiency. Participating in activities that allow for realistic practice and positive and corrective feedback can greatly improve teachers' level of comfort with specific strategies and their rate of implementation.

During this workshop, participants will explore professional development activities in which workshop



participants actually teach students the strategies they are learning. Participants will learn a condensed "Strategic Tutoring Strategy," teach the strategy to local students, and critique videotapes of their tutoring sessions. Participants will be able to employ this technique in leading future workshops.

Hudson, whose "class-within-a-class" (CWC) model is one of the most frequently used service delivery models in schools today, is a staunch advocate of the Strategic Instruction Model. He incorporates both learning strategies and content enhancements into different CWC configurations. Given the challenges confronting teachers in delivering intensive skill/strategy instruction within the context of inclusive settings, Hudson's work on service delivery systems across all grades is especially relevant.

Hudson is highly in demand as a keynote speaker and presenter of educational workshops. He has worked with hundreds of school districts throughout the world.

Hudson, who received the 1997 Award of Excellence from the Kansas CEC Federation and who is the former president of the Division for Learning Disabilities of the CEC, was invited to the White House to present to congressional and White House staff on the importance of legislation supporting learning disabilities.

Hudson is a professor of special education at the University of Kansas and is a former high school teacher, special education teacher, principal, and director of special education.

Lavoie, who holds several degrees in special education, is headmaster at Riverview School in East Sandwich, Massachusetts. Riverview's mission is to provide state-of-the-art services to adolescents with special educational needs.

Among Lavoie's credits are the video "Understanding Learning Disabilities: How Difficult can this be? The F.A.T. City Workshop."

In the F.A.T. City Workshop, parents, educators, psychologists, and social workers participate in a series of classroom activities that cause Frustration, Anxiety, and Tension. The tape allows viewers to look at the world through the eyes of a child with learning disabilities.
