As outlined in this session, SMARTER is designed to enhance the integration of HOTR into everyday teaching practices. This cyclical approach allows for continuous assessment and adjustment of instructional strategies, ensuring that the needs of all learners are met. The synergy between the SMARTER and HOTR is particularly impactful; as educators utilize SMARTER to plan and execute lessons, they can seamlessly incorporate higher order thinking routines to elevate the rigor of their instruction.
