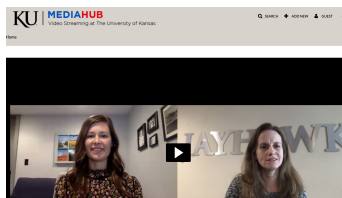

⑦ Example sentence Fidelity of implementation is important to consider when using an EBP because the EBP has been found effective using specific procedures, under certain conditions, and with specific learners.		

¹The term 'evidence-based practice' (EBP) is often used interchangeably with research-based practice; however, there are important distinctions between these terms and educators should be mindful of when and how they are used. The Clarifying Table below provides the core idea underlying the term 'evidence-based practice' and explores connections between the term 'evidence-based practice,' and related practices, programs, and terminology. Consider these questions: If educators use evidence-based practices designed to teach reading skills, is that practice in accordance with the Science of Reading? Is SIM™ evidence-based or research-based? Is SIM on the list of practices schools are permitted to use? Questions such as these drive the purpose behind this article with the hope that it will be useful to SIM Professional Developers encountering similar quandaries in their work. 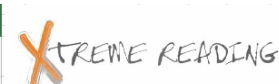

Technology Tools Per Stage of Instruction

What does it look like?	What tools can I use?	Why is it important?
Stage 1: Pretest & Make Commitments <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Aligns with selected and critical skills or content of the lesson or unit Incorporates various levels of difficulty Should be brief and may serve as a discussion prompt to gain buy in Stage 7: Post-test & Make Commitments <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assign task to confirm mastery (mirrors pre-test) Celebrate mastery Discuss achievement and attribution for success Prompt increasing student responsibility Prompt commitment to generalize 	Low-tech: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mail pretest to home and student mails it back Phone call for conferencing on results and make commitments Scheduled dates for car-line pick up/drop off of materials for students Mid-tech: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Email exchange of pretest Phone call or video-conference to discuss results and make commitments High-tech: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Google Forms to complete the pretest/posttest Video-conference to discuss results and make commitments 	Teachers and students who know current performance levels learn important information. Allows for students to set realistic learning goals Celebrate mastery Build a rationale for learning the strategy or generalization the strategy
Stage 2: Describe	Low-tech: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Send home post-it notes on Cue Cards and use highlighters. Binder/folder set up with materials ahead of time 	Allows for students to better understand new or complex information
